Career path statistics for alumni graduating with an IB diploma in the last ten years

The career path is similar to that of alumni with a 'Maturité' diploma, for those students who obtain 32 points or more in the IB Diploma. For the others, their choices are most frequently; art schools, the hospitality industry, business and management (EHL, Glion, BSL, Polycom, IFM, Webster, etc.), particularly for those who obtain IB 'certificates'.

It's important to note that many IB students pursue their studies in other countries (almost a third) compared to Maturité students (11%), which is to be expected. Finally, for both diplomas, the tendency to take a sabbatical year is increasing (more than one third of alumni).
